#### GENERAL

Complete the form legibly and accurately using black ink or typescript. The University will not process forms that are incomplete or where accompanying certificates and documents have been tampered with or altered. **DO NOT WRITE IN THE SHADED AREAS.**

Applicants to the Mona and St. Augustine campuses and to the Faculty of Law must complete the form in **DUPLICATE**. If you are applying to any other Faculty (except the Faculty of Law) at Cave Hill, you are asked to complete **ONE** form only. The forms should be returned to the Admissions Office at the Campus most convenient to you or the UWIDEC Centre nearest to you.

A processing fee of Bds\$15.00 (Jamaican residents \$450), TT\$45.00 or the equivalent, in your local currency is payable by residents of Commonwealth Caribbean Countries. All other applicants are required to pay US\$30. This fee is not refundable, and should be submitted by bank draft / certified cheque.

The deadline date for receipt of applications to all campuses of the University is **January 12, 2007**. Where this deadline date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday, the deadline will be the next working day.

The **ORIGINAL** documents **MUST** be submitted with the application. Birth Certificate, Academic Certificates/Grade Slips (accepted only in cases where the certificates are not yet available), Professional Certificates, Diplomas if applicable, Marriage Certificate/Deed Poll (whichever is applicable) if present name is different from that on documents.

- (vii) A photocopy of the academic certificate(s) must also be submitted along with the original(s).

Applicants to the Associate Degree programme must submit a personal statement of between 250 B 300 words giving his/her reasons for wanting to study in the programme.

Applicants whose native Language is not English are required to perform satisfactorily in an approved English Language Test. The TOEFL test with a minimum score of 500 has been approved for this purpose.

Applicants with qualifications in a language other than English should submit a certified English translation, together with the original.

All candidates are required to submit a short (300 words or less) auto-biographic sketch outlining the reasons for their career choice.

Candidates must produce evidence of their involvement in relevant extra-curricular/co-curricular activities in socially oriented projects and voluntary community service in the year prior to their application. ***Enclosed special insert for this programme must be completed.***
