The Errol Barrow Centre for Creative Imagination (EBCCI) of the University of the West Indies Cave Hill Campus will be showcasing the work of Barbadian Photographer Rasheed Boodhoo in his first solo exhibition in its Art Gallery.

Opening February 6<sup>th</sup> 2011 at 6pm, the exhibition entitled **Heritage Chronicles**; presents Barbados in Black and White “reminiscent of the good old days to those over 20 to 30 years,” says photographer Boodhoo, “not only will it be a nostalgic experience; the exhibition will demonstrate the love I (the artist) has for Barbados.” Imagery will be presented in Matte and on Canvas. The exhibition will close on February 27<sup>th</sup> 2011. The Curator of the exhibition is Mr Ashanti Trotman.

Rasheed Boodhoo sees himself not as a photographer but as a photo artist. His artistic career started whilst working with Omowale Stewart, in the home of Barbadian culture, Yoruba House and De People’s Art Movement in the 1970’s; it was not until 2007 that he complemented his talent, retiring his brush and acrylics for the lens of the camera. Rasheed has won Gold, Silver and Bronze awards at NIFCA, along with the Best Black White Photo and Most Improved Photographer awards. He has participated in group showings of the Barbados Arts Council and the Caribbean Gallery of Art and was the featured photo artist of the 2008 Crop Over Visual Art Exhibition. His greatest achievement was the selection of much of his photographic work for the Barbadian Exhibition at World Expo held in Shanghai China in 2010.

This is the first exhibition for 2011 and according to Producer of the EBCCI, Ms De Carla Applewhaite, “Rasheed’s work is truly a testament to the creative imagination as his lens captures what the eye casually glances at, we are pleased to host such a creative pioneer into our space, during a period we celebrate how far we have come. We welcome all to come see how photography meets fine art.” The exhibition will be open from 11am – 6pm, Tuesday to Friday.
