

Foreword

DOUBLE MAJOR IN EDUCATION

The school of Education is pleased to announce that a Double Major in Education is being offered from this Semester (2006-2007). This is a 90 credit programme which is done over 3 years/6 semesters full time. The Double Major allows students to take a minimum of 36 credits (12 courses) in a subject area.
