On-campus accommodation is calculated for Semester I from August 28 – December 21, 2011 and for Semester II from January 22 – May 09, 2012.

Any resident wanting to remain on Halls outside of the semester will be required to notify the Halls Administrator in advance. The charge is BDS\$40.00 per person per night (single room) and \$30.00 per person per night (double room) \$50.00 person (two-bedroom/Post Graduate). **All fees are to be made payable to the University of the West Indies, Cave Hill Campus.**

Students who are desirous of retaining their rooms over the **Christmas break** are asked to note the additional fee of \$672.00 for undergraduates and \$944.00 for postgraduates for this period.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

Fees Payable to the University

Fees payable for an undergraduate degree programme comprise an **Economic Cost**, a **Tuition Fee** and **University Registration Fees**.

The Governments of **Contributing Countries** normally sponsor their nationals by paying the **Economic cost** portion of their fees while students pay the **University Registration Fees** portions. Arrangements for the payment of tuition fees vary among governments. The countries that contribute to the recurrent budget of the University of the West Indies are listed in **Table 1**. **Schedule I** gives fees payable by citizens of **Contributing Countries**.

Students from **Contributing Countries** who are **not sponsored** are responsible for the full cost of their programme.

Citizens of Caribbean countries **not** listed as Contributing Countries and **International students** pay fees as per **Schedule II**.

Fees quoted for citizens of Contributing Countries (*except the three Campus Countries - Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago*) reflect a discount of 66% of the Economic Cost.

The Barbados Government pays the tuition fees and economic cost for its nationals for the minimum period required for a **first degree**, plus one additional year where necessary. This applies to the pursuit of **one** undergraduate degree only but does not apply to self-financing programmes such as the MBBS.

Full-time vs Part-time for citizens of Contributing Countries

If you are in the **Faculty of Pure and Applied Sciences** and you are taking a course load of fourteen (14) or more credits per semester you will be charged the full-time fee. If you are in the **Faculty of Social Sciences**, the **Faculty of Humanities & Education**, or the **Faculty of Law** and you are taking a course load of twelve (12) or more credits per semester you will be charged the full-time fee.

Students in these faculties taking fewer credits / courses are classified as part-time and are charged fees on a per-credit basis. Part-time students can register for a **maximum of three (3) courses per semester**.

If you are in the **Faculty of Medical Sciences**, and not undertaking a full-time course load, your part-time fee is **fixed** and not calculated by credit.

Notes

All fees in this document are quoted in Barbados Dollars - BDS\$)

All students are required to register every semester during the published registration period and pay the University Registration fees.

Students whose fees are unpaid after the cut-off date published for the semester will be deemed not to be registered. Such students will be ineligible to attend classes and write examinations.

Fees are set by University Council and revised annually.

Special Student Categories

Students who wish to read courses outside a degree programme are referred to as *Specially Admitted Students*. Fees for Specially Admitted students are shown in **Schedule III**.

Students who wish to audit courses without being examined are referred to as *Occasional Students*. The fees for auditing courses are shown in **Schedule IV**.

Administrative fees for students who have been given permission to register for *Examinations Only* in a course which they have previously failed are shown in **Schedule IV**.

Persons registered with other Universities pursuing courses in programmes at the U.W.I. are termed *Study Abroad Students*. The fees for *Study Abroad* students are given in **Schedule V**.

Living and Other Expenses

Living expenses are provided in **Schedule VI**.

Students who do not reside in Barbados should make provision for the cost of a return airfare and allocate approximately Bds\$500.00 to meet their “settling-in” expenses in Barbados.

Scholarship, Bursary and other award holders are advised to travel with enough money to cover the cost of at least one month’s expenses pending receipt of their emoluments.

This example shows how to calculate fees as a part-time student from Barbados, Jamaica or Trinidad & Tobago in the **Faculty of Social Sciences** taking 2 courses in Semester 1 and 3 courses in Semester 2, where each course chosen is worth three (3) credits. Note that University Registration fees are additional to the programme fees.
