FINANCIAL INFORMATION FOR GRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Cost of Graduate Programmes

Graduate programmes are considered in two categories.

- 1) Programmes funded by the University Grants Committee (*referred to as UGC-funded*), and
- 2) Programmes which not UGC-funded (*referred to as Self-Financed*).

Explanation of Terms re: cost of UGC-Funded Programmes

The cost of a UGC-funded graduate degree programme comprises an **Economic Cost**, a **Tuition Fee** and **University Fees**. **Sponsorship** of a student refers to a situation in which the **Economic Cost** *, and in some cases the **Tuition Fee**, is paid to the University on behalf of the student by a third party. All fees are set by University Council and revised annually.

Contributing Countries are those which contribute to the recurrent budget of the University of the West Indies. These are listed in **Table 1**. Sponsorship of citizens of Contributing Countries by their Governments for graduate degree programmes is dependent on the policy of the individual Government.

* UGC fees quoted for citizens of Contributing Countries (*except the three Campus Countries - Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago*) include a discount of approximately 66% of the Economic Cost.

Schedule VI gives the list of UGC-funded programmes while fees for these programmes are shown in **Schedule V**.

Students from Caribbean Countries not listed as Contributing countries, International students, and students from Contributing countries who are not sponsored are responsible for the full payment of their programme fees.

All students are required to register on-line and pay the **University Fees (Guild Fee and Amenities Fee)** – every semester until their degree has been awarded. The **ID card fee** is billed on first registration.

Notes to Schedule VII:

1. Fees for **Self-Financed** programmes are charged on a per-credit basis. The per-credit cost is calculated by dividing the programme cost by the number of credits in the programme and multiplying by the number of credits in the particular component (course/research paper/practicum) being taken.

e.g. *A student taking 3-credit courses in the Master of Social Work programme would be billed:*
 $\$20,000 \text{ (cost)} / 39 \text{ (total credits)} * 3 \text{ (credits per course)}$
 $= \$1,538.46 \text{ per course.}$

The 9-credit practicum would be billed at:
 $\$20,000 / 39 * 9 = \$ 4,615.38$

2. All persons undertaking the **M.Sc. International Management** programme must make allowance for pre-programme costs as follows:

Intensive Management	BDS \$1,200
Intensive Language	BDS \$1,500

3. The programme fee for the **M.Sc. International Trade Policy** programme is payable in full at the start of the programme. Persons undertaking this programme must also make an additional allowance of BDS \$5,000 for the one-month overseas attachment that forms an integral part of their programme.
4. All part-time students in the **Faculty of Law** pay BDS\$5,000 per written course. No additional programme fees are billed for the research paper.
5. Students in **Self-Financed** programmes who have failed a course outright and are required by the Board of Examiners to re-take that course, must register and pay the full per-credit cost of the course again.
6. The MPhil and PhD in Governance and Public Policy, Social Policy, Economic Development Policy, the Diploma in Family Medicine and the M.Sc. in Family Medicine programmes are billed every semester.

Fees Payable for Self-Financed Programmes

Schedule VII shows the list, cost and credits of Self-Financed programmes.

Special Student Categories

Students who wish to **read courses outside a degree programme** are referred to as **Specially Admitted Students**. Fees for reading courses in **UGC-funded** programmes are shown in **Schedule I**. Fees for Specially Admitted students in **Self-Financed** programmes are outlined in the notes to **Schedule VII**

Students who wish to **audit courses** in **UGC-funded** programmes without being examined are referred to as **Occasional Students**. The fees for auditing courses are shown in **Schedule II**.

Administrative fees for students who have been given permission to register for **Examinations Only** in a course which they have previously failed are shown in **Schedule II**.

Persons registered with other Universities pursuing courses in **UGC-funded** programmes at the U.W.I. are termed **Study Abroad Students**. The fees for these students are given in **Schedule III**.

Living and Other Expenses

- Living expenses are provided in **Schedule VIII**.
- Students who do not reside in Barbados should make provision for the cost of a return airfare and allocate approximately Bds\$500.00 to meet their “settling-in” expenses in Barbados.
- Scholarship, Bursary and other award holders are advised to travel with enough money to cover the cost of at least one month’s expenses pending receipt of their emoluments.
- Graduate students are **strongly encouraged** to make provision for the purchase of a **laptop computer**.
- Provision should be made for the production of Research Papers and Theses estimated as follows: An examination fee may also apply – see **SCHEDULE IV**.

Notes

1. Students who are working for more than 12 hours a week are **not** permitted to register as full-time.
2. **Part-time** refers to the number of courses being undertaken. Most graduate courses are conducted in the evening.
3. All students (*except Specially Admitted students*) are required to register and pay Amenities and Guild fees every semester. The ID card fee is paid by all students on first registration only. Specially Admitted students are required to register every semester but are **not** required to pay Guild fees.
4. Persons undertaking a part-time course load and whose programmes will therefore last more than one (1) year are advised that the fees quoted here are for the academic year 2011-2012. Fees are revised upward annually.
5. Fees quoted above are for a full academic year however all students are billed by semester on registration.
