Professor Emeritus George D. Nicholson was a member of The University of the West Indies for 32 years (1970-2002), serving in many capacities ranging from Lecturer (Internal Medicine) to Dean – Faculty of Medical Sciences and University Dean. With a focus in the area of Nephrology, Prof. Nicholson was a pioneer in the treatment of chronic renal diseases and spearheaded the creation of the Hemodialysis Unit at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, serving as its Director from 1979-2002. Professor Nicholson was the publisher of many peer reviewed articles; member of national, regional and international societies focusing on the advancement of renal replacement and treatment; and a highly respected academic and teacher.

FIRST HAEMODIALYSIS AT HOLBERTON HOSPITAL on transfer from Princess Margaret Hospital, Dominica.

On examination he is a thin young man who shows evidence of under-nutrition. There is decreased muscle mass, moderate ascites, and 2+ oedema to the mid-tibia. The cardiac apex is in the 6ICS in the Anterior axillary line and there is a soft blowing systolic murmur at the apex and left sternal edge. The chest is clinically clear.

His haemoglobin was reportedly 3.96/dl and he was transfused 2 units of packed red cells on 9/06/28.

This date: Pre-dialysis BP 134/96 mmHg (sitting) at 42.6 kg.

Resenius F6 dialyzer: Bicarbonate dialysis.

Blood pump speed 300 ml/min. Some initial difficulty with high venous pressures resolved by replacement of needle (repositioning).

Uneventful

Be made to optimise cannulation.
