Qualifications for Undergraduate Entry

To qualify for entry, applicants must satisfy both the general matriculation requirements of the University and the specific requirements of the faculty in which their programme of interest is located.

General Matriculation Requirements

Four-Year Entry (Basic Entry Requirements): Minimum of five (5) CSEC (CXC) subjects (General Proficiency Grades I-3) and/or GCE 'O' Levels (Grades A-C), including English Language and either a foreign language, mathematics, geography, or an approved science subject; or equivalent qualifications.

Three-Year Entry: Basic Entry Requirements PLUS two (2) two-unit CAPE subjects AND/OR GCE 'A' Levels, or equivalent.

The UWI accepts a range of international qualifications including:

- French or International Baccalaureate (IB)
- Associate Degrees
- West African Senior School Certificate Examination WASSCE/SSSCE)
- SAT / ACT/ Advanced Placement (with high school transcript)
- Dutch Qualifications
- Canadian Secondary School Diplomas
- The German Abitur

English Language Requirements

All applicants to undergraduate degree programmes at The University of the West Indies must possess English Language qualification.

If your first language is not English, you are required to provide satisfactory evidence that your competency in English is adequate.

EITHER

The Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) – A mark of 500 on the paper-based test or 82* on the internet-based test.

*TOEFL Internet-based Breakdown

A minimum writing score of	22
A minimum reading score of	20
A minimum listening score of	20
A minimum speaking score of	20

OR

A certificate showing a minimum total score of 6.5 on the University of Cambridge IELTS (International English Language Testing System).

English Language Proficiency Test

All applicants to The University of the West Indies are required to take the English Language Proficiency Test (ELPT), unless exempted.

Mathematics Proficiency Test

All applicants to the Faculties of Social Sciences and Sport are required to take the Mathematics Proficiency Test (MPT), unless exempted.

FACULTY OF CULTURE, CREATIVE & PERFORMING ARTS

Three-Year Programme

- Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language and either one (1) of the following: a foreign language, Mathematics, Geography, or an approved science subject
 - Plus three (3) other subjects
- Passes in at least two 2-unit CXC CAPE/GCE A' Level subjects (or equivalents)

OR

- An Associate Degree from an approved Tertiary Level Institute with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5

OR

- A Diploma pursued over three (3) years from an approved Teacher's Training College or a Diploma pursued over two (2) years, together with a one-year internship, provided that the holder has at least four (4) CSEC General Proficiency (Grade I-III) or GCE O-Level passes including English Language

OR

- Other approved Diplomas and Certificates

Four-Year Programme

- Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language and either one (1) of the following: a foreign language, Mathematics, Geography, or an approved science subject
 - Plus three (3) other subjects

Programme-specific Requirements

Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) Degree Programme

The Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree follows a programme of study in two arts disciplines (drawn from dance, theatre and moving picture arts). Prior to admission to the programme, all qualified applicants to the BFA are required to submit a sample of their creative work and take part in an interview. To learn more about the submission of creative work, please reference the **FCCPA Applicant Brief**.

DANCE: Applicants intending to specialise in **Dance** will be assessed by a ballet or modern dance sequence, as well as a one to two-minute self-choreographed or repertory solo to instrumental music (Other dance styles are welcomed in the solo audition). Applicants must also submit a resumé or brief summary of Dance Study, written goals statement narrative and a DVD of his/her work. Group work and performance footage are accepted.

THEATRE: Applicants specialising in **Theatre** are required to audition. They are expected to prepare and present (i) two prepared actor's pieces, including a monologue and/or (ii) a song or a segment of a song of no more than two minutes in length.

FILM: Applicants specialising in **Film** are required to submit a creative work (film/video) of one to three minutes in length, in which they played a key creative role (writer, director, editor). Alternatively, applicants may submit three film clips which have inspired them with brief notes as to why they have selected each clip. A photo-essay, photo-story and/or portfolio of photographs are also accepted with the submission.

- OR
- An Associate Degree from an approved Tertiary Level Institute with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5

- A Diploma pursued over three (3) years from an approved Teacher's Training College or a Diploma pursued over two (2) years, together with a one-year internship, provided that the holder has at least four (4) CXC CSEC General Proficiency (Grade I-III) or GCE O' Level passes including English Language
- OR
- Other approved Diplomas and Certificates

Four-Year Programme

- Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language and either one (1) of the following: a foreign language, Mathematics, Geography, or an approved science subject

- Passes in at least two 2-unit CXC CAPE/GCE A' Level subjects (or equivalents)

OR

- An Associate Degree from an approved Tertiary Level Institute with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5

Four-Year Programme

- Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language and either one (1) of the following: a foreign language, Mathematics, Geography, or an approved science subject
 - Plus three (3) other subjects

NB: Applicants applying to the Department of Economics and the Sagior Cave Hill School of Business and Management must have CXC CSEC Mathematics.

Programme-specific Requirements

BSc Hospitality & Tourism Management

This is a four-year programme which is offered jointly with the Barbados Community College.

Applicants are required to first complete:

- The two-year Associate Degree in Applied Arts- Tourism and Travel

OR

- The Associate Degree in Applied Arts - Hotel Catering & Institutional Operations (or equivalent) with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.75 before being admitted to years 3 and 4 in the Faculty

BSc Social Work

Each applicant, irrespective of academic qualifications, must do the following:

- Request two (2) referees to submit to the Assistant Registrar (Admissions) CONFIDENTIAL references on the applicant attesting to his/her suitability for professional Social Work
- Submit, along with the application, a personal statement of between 250 and 300 words giving his/her reasons for wanting to study for the degree in Social Work
- Attend, as requested, an interview with the Faculty of Social Sciences personnel or, in respect of applicants from non-campus countries, with persons nominated by the Faculty

Three-Year Programme

 - Compulsory – English, Mathematics, and one (1) lab science subject
 - Plus two (2) other subjects
- Passes in at least two 2-unit CXC CAPE/GCE A' Level subjects (or equivalents)

OR

- An Associate Degree from an approved Tertiary Level Institute with a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5

Four-Year Programme

 - Compulsory – English, Mathematics, and one (1) lab science subject
 - Plus two (2) other subjects

Bachelor of Health Sciences

Duration of the Programme

Three (3) years of full-time study | Seven (7) years of part-time study

Programme-specific Requirements

- **Basic Qualifications:** Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics
- Passes in CXC CAPE (two-unit courses)/GCE A' Level (or equivalents) in at least two (2) subjects from: Biology/Zoology, Chemistry, and a non-science subject

Applications to enter the Bachelor of Health Sciences also will be considered for persons with the following qualifications:

- Associate degrees, diploma(s) and certificate(s) from other health science programmes at reputable institutions, as well as relevant work experience, as long as they hold the basic qualifications
- UWI Faculty of Science and Technology Preliminary Courses (N1): Chemistry and Life Sciences

NB: Associate degrees, diplomas and certificates, along with relevant work/research experience, also will be considered for entry for mature persons (age 21 and older) who also possess the basic qualifications. This also applies to the BSc Human Nutrition and Dietetics programme.

Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)

Duration of the Programme

Five (5) years of full-time study

Programme-specific Requirements

- Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language, Mathematics, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics
- Passes in CXC CAPE (two-unit courses)/GCE A' Level (or equivalents) in at least three (3) subjects according to any one of the following schemes:
 - Scheme A – Chemistry, Biology/Zoology and either Physics or Mathematics
 - Scheme B – Biology/Zoology, Chemistry and a non-science subject
- Applicants must have attained their 18th birthday by December 30 of the year of entry.

Applications to enter the MBBS also will be considered in the following categories:

- **Applicants Holding UWI Science Degrees** – a UWI first degree from the Faculties of Science and Technology (formerly Pure and Applied Sciences) with a minimum of lower second-class honours
- **Degrees from Other Universities** – a degree from a university recognised by The UWI, with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, granted credits have been obtained in Biology / Zoology and Chemistry
- **Associate Degrees from Community Colleges** – a triple major Associate Degree from an approved community college with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or greater
- **Equivalent Qualifications** – other qualifications which are deemed by the Faculty to be equivalent to the categories above as determined from official transcripts

BSc Human Nutrition and Dietetics

Duration of the Programme

Three and a half (3.5) years of full-time study | Six (6) years of part-time study

Programme-specific Requirements

- **Basic Qualifications:** Passes in at least five (5) CXC CSEC (General Proficiency) or GCE O' Level subjects (or equivalents):
 - Compulsory – English Language, Mathematics, Biology and/or Human and Social Biology, Chemistry
 - Plus one (1) other subject

Passes in CXC CAPE (two-unit courses)/GCE A' Level passes (or equivalents) in two (2) subjects, at least one of which must be a science subject: Biology, Chemistry or Physics

- Applicants must have attained their 18th birthday by December 30 of the year of entry.

Applications to enter the BSc in Human Nutrition and Dietetics also will be considered in the following categories:

- **Associate Degrees from Community Colleges** – an Associate Degree from an approved community college with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or greater
- **Degrees from Other Universities** – a degree in the appropriate natural science from a university recognised by The UWI, with a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- **Equivalent Qualifications** – other qualifications which are deemed by the Faculty to be equivalent to the categories above as determined from official transcripts

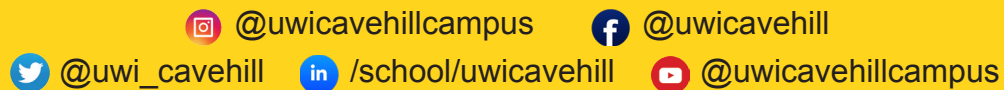

- Recent and/or sustained involvement of the applicant in such activities will be considered in assessing the suitability of applicants for a career in Human Nutrition and Dietetics.

In addition to the co-curricular form, applicants to this Faculty must submit a short (300 words or less) autobiographic sketch outlining the reasons for their career choice.
