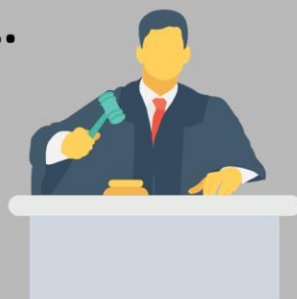

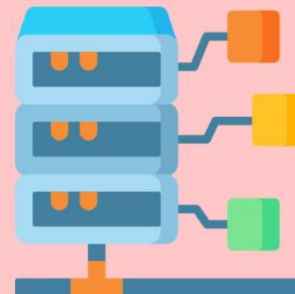

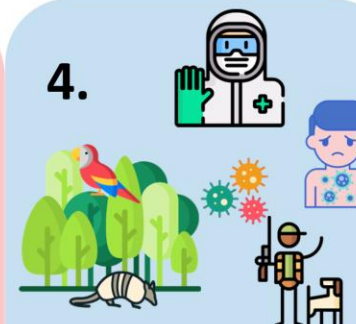

WILDLIFE CRIME DATABASE

Development of a regional wildlife database that can capture real-time data from across the Caribbean to help to inform regional wildlife and environmental management agencies, Ministries of Agriculture, Tourism, Foreign Affairs & International Trade, Finance, Ministry of Home Affairs, Office of Attorney General of trends and incidents that can affect national and regional security.

ZOONOTIC DISEASE RISK ASSESSMENT
