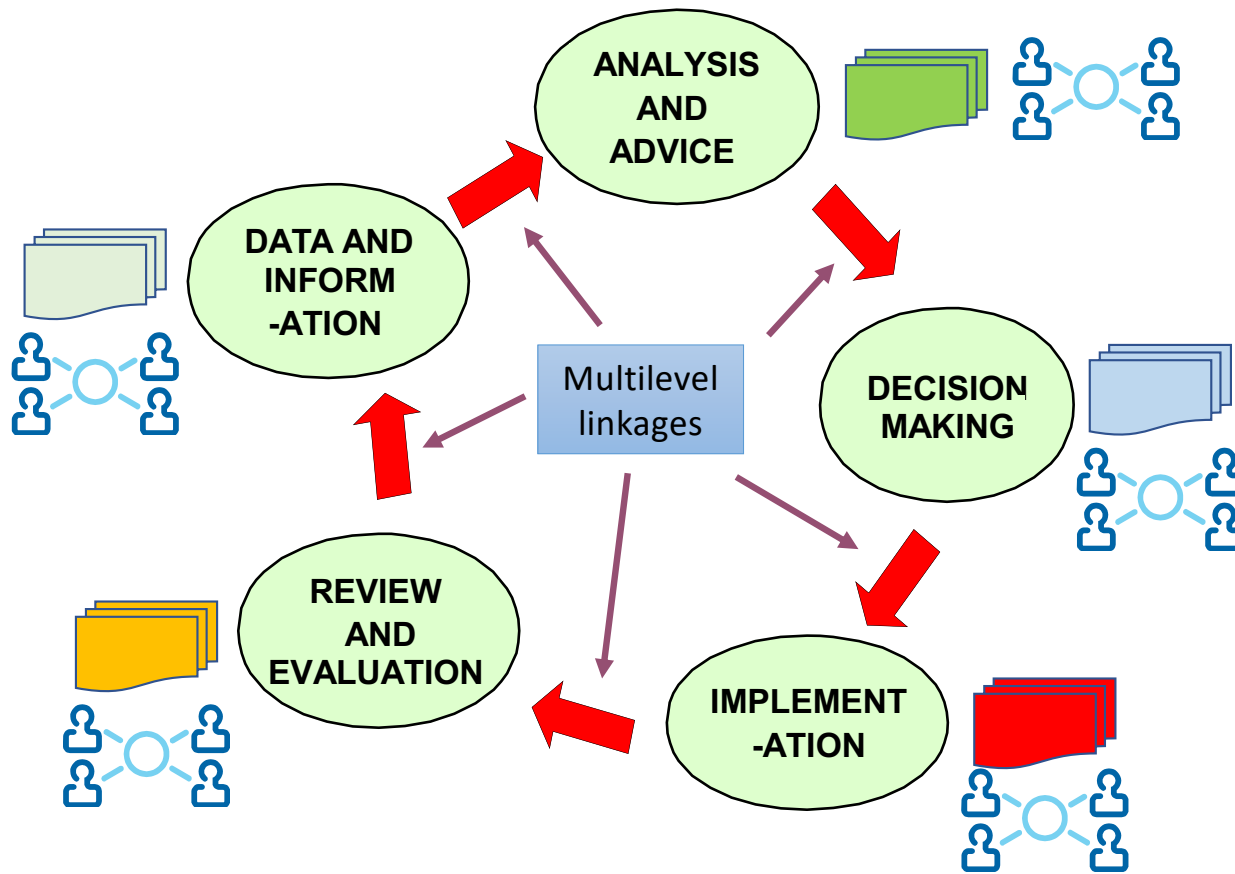

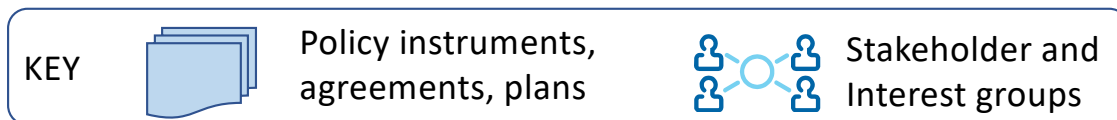
Sites of exchange where scientists of any type and other actors communicate in various ways in a policy domain or process for co-developing knowledge to enhance evidence-based policy decision-making

The Caribbean Community Common Fisheries Policy (CCCFP)

FACT SHEET

The Caribbean Community Common Fisheries Policy (CCCFP) is a binding treaty providing for cooperation and collaboration of Caribbean States and governments in conserving, managing and sustainably utilizing marine and coastal resources. The policy respects the rights and interests of Caribbean peoples, with all coming from a strong national identity. The policy, which is the only regional law, is that applies for every fishery in every state of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) member of state. The treaty has:

The Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM) is committed to leading under the mandate for states to take the necessary steps to ensure implementation and monitoring of the policy. The CRFM is the central mechanism for the implementation of the policy and is responsible for the management of the policy and for the monitoring of the policy.

CCCFP purpose

CCCFP objectives are to ensure the sustainable use of marine and coastal resources, to ensure that the policy is implemented and monitored, and to ensure that the policy is updated and revised as necessary. The policy is implemented and monitored through the Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM).

Protecting and preserving the resource

Protecting and preserving the resource is a key objective of the policy. The policy aims to ensure that the resource is managed in a sustainable manner, taking into account the needs of future generations. The policy also aims to ensure that the resource is protected from over-exploitation and degradation.

Creating jobs and improving incomes

Creating jobs and improving incomes is another key objective of the policy. The policy aims to ensure that the fishing sector is a source of employment and income for Caribbean peoples. The policy also aims to ensure that the fishing sector is a source of income for Caribbean peoples.

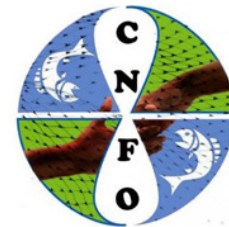

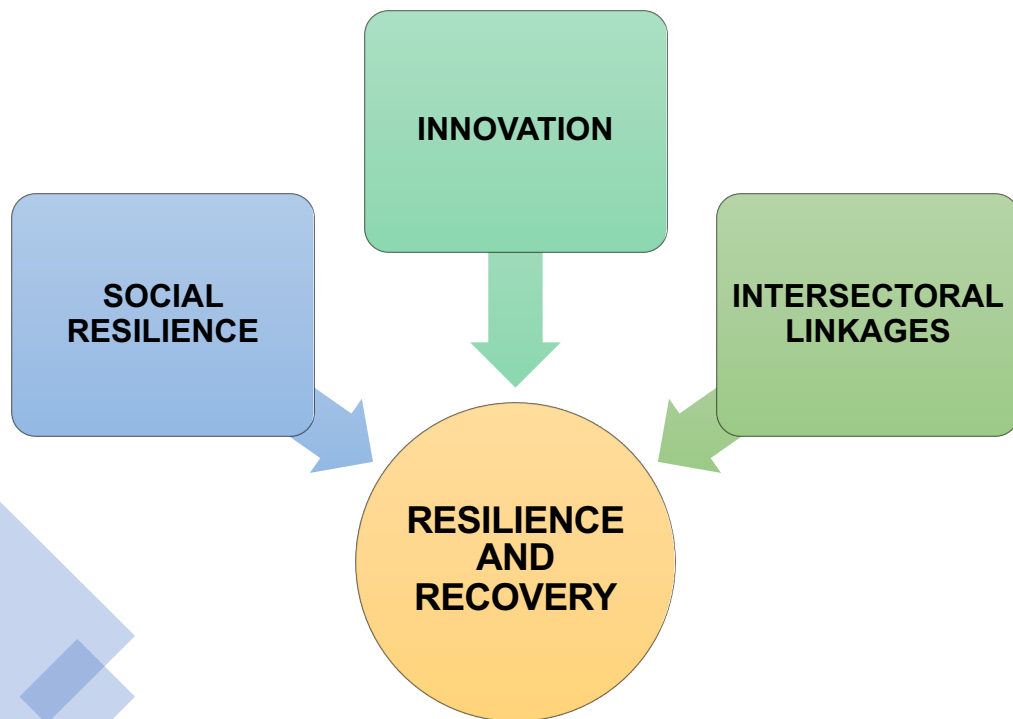

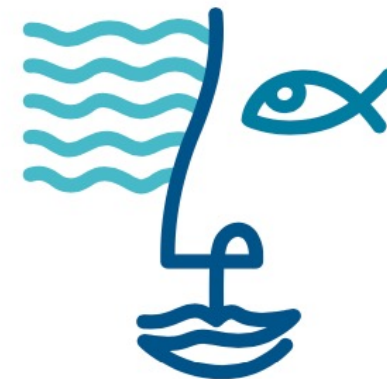
