- 40 million Deaths globally— 75% of deaths and 40% of premature deaths
- High Blood Pressure leading risk factor for death
- Diabetes prevalence double global rates
- Adult overweight / obesity highest rates globally:
  - up to 69%
  - up to 30% among children



- Risk factors and cost on the rise
- Estimated that the cost of dialysis for a single individual is equivalent to that for 30 persons
- BDS\$64 million spent on CVD & diabetes
- economy may be losing as much as BDS\$145 million annually
