BCC - ASSOCIATE DEGREE: GPA 2.75

Students who have completed the Associate Degree in Business Studies with a GPA of 2.75 or greater are eligible for advanced standing in the B.Sc. Management, B.Sc. Management (Entrepreneurship), B.Sc. Management (Marketing), B.Sc. Management (Human Resource Management), B.Sc. Management (International Business), B.Sc. Management (Tourism & Hospitality Management), B.Sc. Public Sector Management or B.Sc. Accounting. Students who have completed the Associate Degree in Accounting with a GPA of 2.75 or greater are eligible for advanced standing in the B.Sc. Accounting and exemptions from B.Sc. Accounting & Finance. Students who have completed the Associate Degree in Public Sector Management with a GPA of 2.75 or greater are eligible for advanced standing in the B.Sc. Public Sector Management. Advanced standing means that students are eligible for entry into level **two (2)** of the programmes. However, students are asked to note that they are required to complete **three (3)**

foundation courses. Such students should seek counselling from their student advisor before completing their registration online.

You may be granted an exemption with credit if you have successfully completed the Caribbean Advanced Proficiency Examinations (CAPE) in the following subjects with a minimum grade of IV for the UWI course listed in the table below.
