REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Act No. 10 of 1985

AN ACT for the Incorporation of the Auxiliary, Child-Care Trinidad and Tobago Association of Trinidad, West Indies and matters incidental thereto.

[Assented to 2nd April, 1985]

Preamble.

WHEREAS there has been established in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago an Association known as the Auxiliary Child-Care Trinidad-and Tobago Association;

And whereas it is expedient that the said Association be incorporated under the name of the Auxiliary Child-Care Trinidad and Tobago Association of Trinidad and Tobago, West Indies.

Enactment.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows: -

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Auxiliary Child-Care Trinidad and Tobago Association (Incorporation) Act, 1985.

Incorporation.

2. The Auxiliary Child-Care Trinidad and Tobago Association (hereinafter called "The Association") is created a body corporate.

Aims and objects.

3. The aims and objects of the Association are as follows:

- (a) to supplement the efforts of all properly constituted bodies in Trinidad and Tobago whose main purpose is to care for children who are sick, physically or mentally handicapped, deprived or delinquent;
- (b) to solicit and obtain funds from overseas sources, private persons, families, associations, government and government agencies, service clubs and other organisations interested in helping private associations doing child-care work.

Vesting of property.

4. All property now owned by any person on behalf of the Association or vested in any person for use of the Association is vested in the Association.

Mode of execution of documents.

5. All documents requiring the seal of the Association shall be sealed with the common seal in the presence of at least two officers of the association who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Association.

Service of documents.

6. (i) The Association shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on the Association and such address shall be registered with the Registrar General.

(ii) All documents to be served on the Association may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the registered office.

(iii) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is an offence and renders the Association liable on summary conviction to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

7. The Association may from time to time make rules and regulations for the proper conduct of its proceedings and discharge of its duties, powers and functions with power to vary or revoke such rules and regulations.

Savings of State and other rights.

8. Nothing in this Act affects the right of the State or of any other person or body except those mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
