PREFACE

The ongoing pandemic ushered in adjustments to the worksphere at SALISES Cave Hill. This covered the gamut of research, project management, library services and support administration linked to our Outreach and Institute publications. Where the first wave lockdown led to a curtailment of activities, the team moved to pursue its customary goals with the shared understanding that our goals will be moving targets as we sought to live with the threat of the Delta variant of COVID-19. There was also the closure of the Campus due to the mid-April 2021 ashfall from the eruption of the La Soufrière Volcano in St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

The re-opening of the Campus would see a continuation of remote working from home across Units including SALISES, but here more emphasis was placed through roster adjustments to secure an office presence for key functions, deliverables and services the Institute offers.

Two key pivots occurred with respect to the research impetus. One: Fellows began turning towards state-of-the-art questions in their respective research enquiries and two: the period between April and July saw a stepped up effort to prepare and bid for large grants. Two such funding proposals were submitted for review by July 31, 2021. One, a collaboration with State Carolina University in relation to *Climate Change and Livelihood Impacts* and another with Queen Mary University in London and Leiden University on *China and South-South Relations*.

One esteem highlight to note was Don D. Marshall's promotion to the rank of Professor in May 2021. His Professorship is in the area of International Political Economy and Development Studies and staff extended congratulations to him on this signal achievement.

Music, Innovation and Economic Development Forum

IISD Canada/SALISES Tracking Progress in the SDGs Initiative
