WORK OF THE INSTITUTE - OUTREACH

14th Annual Caribbean Child Research Conference

The Caribbean Child Research Conference is an annual research conference which aims to share research on children, strengthen the network of researchers on children's issues, and encourage critical investigation in areas that are often "under-researched." The Conference is not only about children, it involves their active participation. Specifically, this Conference features presentations on child-related issues by renowned Caribbean researchers as well as students from Primary and Secondary schools.

The Conference was held for twelve (12) years in Jamaica under the auspices of SALISES, Mona Campus, UWI and in 2018 for its 13th staging, it was held in Trinidad and Tobago under the auspices of SALISES, St. Augustine Campus, UWI. In 2019, the Conference was held in Barbados organised by SALISES, Cave Hill Campus, UWI and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF, Eastern Caribbean). The Conference spanned two (2) days from November 14 – 15, 2019, under the theme: "***The CRC @30: What does it mean for Caribbean Children?***".

Professor Hilbourne Watson's Book Launch

Services are still being provided to students, in the procurement of articles not readily available in the library and offering a quiet place of study and research.

The library staff also assist in efforts by the SALISES team to organize the various yearly conferences. With respect to the period under review, the 14th Annual Caribbean Child Research Conference was held in November at the LESC and was a huge success. The Library participated in the showcase and unveiling of the W. Arthur Lewis Portraiture in January of 2020 and the portraiture is currently housed in the Audine Wilkinson Library for viewing by all coming into the CARICOM Building.
