CATEGORIES OF STUDENTS

Fees payable by students pursuing postgraduate degrees and diplomas at The University of the West Indies are set periodically by the University Council and are calculated based on country of citizenship, faculty, category of programme, registration status, etc.

Regional Students

There are two main categories of Regional Students:

- Citizens of countries that contribute financially to the recurrent budget of The University (Contributing Countries)
 and
- Citizens of countries that do not contribute financially to the recurrent budget of The University (Non-Contributing Countries).

Contributing Countries are further divided into **Campus Countries** (countries where physical campuses of The University are located) and **Non-Campus Countries**.

International Students

Students who are not recognised as Regional Students are classified as International Students. Fees for International Students are published in the separate schedule of *Fees for International Students*.

CATEGORIES OF PROGRAMMES

For financial purposes, there are two categories of programmes:

University Grants Committee (UGC) Funded programmes are programmes that are supported in part by the contributing countries of the university through the UGC (See detailed financial information on UGC-funded programmes on pages 3 to 7 and the list of such courses on page 5).

Self-financed programmes are programmes for which students pay the full cost (See detailed financial information and the list of self-financed programmes on pages 8 -11).

The University's Academic Year is divided into two main semesters (Semester 1: August – December and Semester 2: January – May). There is also a summer term relevant to self-financed programmes only. A person is considered to be a student at The UWI only if he/she has registered for courses and paid all required fees for a given semester or has made satisfactory arrangements with the Bursary for the payment of fees.

CATEGORIES OF FEES

There are **two main categories of fees** payable by all postgraduate students - **University Registration Fees** (miscellaneous fees including Amenities Fee, Guild Fee and Science Fee (Science & Technology students only); and **Programme Fees**.

University Registration Fees

University Registration Fees include a number of miscellaneous fees that are payable at Registration. These include a **Guild Fee** and an **Amenities Fee** payable by all students, and a **Science Fee** for students in the Faculty of Science and Technology only. **These fees are mandatory for ALL students, including sponsored students and scholarship holders,** and may be paid in two installments, at the start of the first and second semester, or in full at the start of each academic year. Every student must also pay a one-time fee for an ID card, payable on first registration. Replacement of lost ID cards also carries this fee. **University Registration Fees must be paid BEFORE the start of the registration process and are non-refundable**.

INFORMATION FOR UGC-FUNDED PROGRAMMES

Programme Fees

Programme Fees in UGC-funded programmes comprise **Tuition Fees** and **Economic Cost** and are calculated every semester based on your country of citizenship, faculty, and registration status (full-time or part-time).

A student may register either **full-time** or **part-time**. Registration for courses is completed online via the student administration system (CHOL). You are required to register for every programme element to be undertaken during the semester, e.g. course, thesis, workshop, seminar, research paper. The online course selection process must be completed **before** the Programme Fees payable for the semester can be generated. However, before the course registration process can be completed the University Registration Fees must be paid.

Payment of Programme Fees

As noted earlier, Programme Fees in UGC-funded programmes comprise Tuition Fees and Economic Cost.

Whether or not the student is responsible for paying all or part of the Programme Fees themselves depends on their country of citizenship.

- Regional Governments have different arrangements regarding the portion of fees they will pay on behalf of their
 citizens, and which students they will sponsor. It is therefore each student's responsibility to obtain written
 confirmation from his/her government of the amount of government sponsorship, if any, and to know his/her
 personal financial obligation BEFORE taking up a place at the Campus.
- The Government of Barbados pays the Tuition Fees and Economic Cost on behalf of Barbadian students pursuing UGC-funded programmes, subject to specific terms and criteria (see information at https://www.cavehill.uwi.edu/gradstudies/scholarships-funding/barbados-government-sponsorship.aspx
- The Economic Cost for students from **Contributing Non-Campus Countries** pursuing UGC-funded programs is calculated based on a discount of approximately 66%.
- Students from Non-Contributing Countries generally pay a fixed Programme Fee.

The Fees quoted in the table below are **Annual Full-Time** Fees. Fees **per semester** are half of the Annual Fees.

GENERATION OF FEES BASED ON REGISTRATION

- Programme Fees are generated by online registration.
- You are expected to register during the assigned week of every semester until your degree has been awarded.
- Registration is done online through Cave Hill On-Line (CHOL) and you are required to identify **every** programme element *course, thesis, workshop, seminar, research paper, etc* being undertaken that semester.
- The requirement to register online and pay relevant fees every semester **continues** while you are doing your Thesis/ Research Paper/ Practicum/ Internship.
- You are permitted to make changes to course registration until the end of the third week of the semester.
- If your fees are being paid by your Government or other sponsor you should note that these invoices are

submitted to the sponsor by the University at the end of the third week of each semester. It is therefore **essential** that if you have any difficulty registering that you email gradstudies@cavehill.uwi.edu before that deadline so that any problems can be resolved.

Invoices that are not honoured due to late registration will become your responsibility.

SPECIALLY ADMITTED STUDENTS

Persons who wish to take courses outside a degree programme are referred to as *Specially Admitted Students*. Fees for Specially Admitted students are given below. *Specially Admitted Students* are allowed to attend classes and write examinations and are also required to pay the University Amenities Fee.

If you are in an MA, MEd or MSc UGC-funded Taught Masters programme, have exceeded **the expected duration of your programme** and have been granted an extension to permit you to complete your project or research paper, a reduced **Project Only** fee will apply for the extension semester(s):

You will need to email gradstudies@cavehill.uwi.edu within the first 3 weeks of the semester in which the course is next offered with details of the course code for which you are to be registered.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR UGC-FUNDED PROGRAMMES

- Research students who are working for more than 12 hours a week must register as part-time.
- Part-time for non-research students refers to the number of courses being undertaken (a maximum of nine (9) credits per semester) rather than the time of day. Note that most postgraduate courses are conducted in the evening.
- Persons whose programmes will last more than one (1) year are advised that fees are charged annually and the fees quoted here are for the academic year 2024-2025. All fees are subject to revision.
- Fees can be paid in full at the start of the academic year or by semester.
- The **Economic Cost** portion of the fees for citizens of Contributing Countries (*except the three Campus Countries Barbados, Jamaica and Trinidad & Tobago*) includes a discount of approximately 66%.

INFORMATION FOR SELF-FINANCED PROGRAMMES

Programme Fees

The UWI Cave Hill Campus offers many postgraduate programmes that are not UGC-funded and for which Programme Fees are billed as Tuition Costs only. These are known as Self-financed Programmes. Most of these programmes are Taught Masters or Postgraduate Diplomas which have an **overall** Tuition Cost for a stated number of programme credits. The portion of fees to be paid each semester is calculated after the courses to be taken that semester are selected. These fees are due **by the end of the Registration period**. Students are generally responsible for the payment of their Programme Fees in Self-Financed Programmes, but some students may be sponsored.

A few Self-financed Programmes are research degrees (MPhils or PhDs) or specialists programmes which have an **annual** rather than overall Tuition Cost. These programmes may include a small number of credits along with the extensive research and other requirements.

Following are the list of Self-financed Postgraduate Programmes, including the number of credits. Separate lists are provided for programmes with an **overall** tuition cost and programmes with an **annual** tuition cost.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SELF-FINANCED PROGRAMMES

ADDITIONAL FEES/PRE-PROGRAMME WORKSHOPS/SEMINARS

- Based on your academic background you may be required to undertake additional pre-programme workshops/ seminars/ courses. These additional requirements are billed for separately. Your Programme Coordinator / Academic Advisor will advise if this requirement applies to you.
- Note 1: If you are undertaking the *M.Sc. International Trade Policy* programme you must make an additional allowance of BDS \$5,000 for the one-month overseas attachment that forms an integral part of that programme.
- Note 2: If you are undertaking the *Postgraduate Diploma or MSc Information Technology (Enterprise Systems, Mobile Applications, Web Development)*, you must make provision for an additional BDS \$5,000 to cover the cost of a specialized laptop and a mobile phone that are essential for these programmes.

RE-REGISTRATION FOR RESEARCH PAPERS/ INTERNSHIPS/PRACTICUMS

You may find that your Research Paper/Internship /Practicum is not completed in the first semester of registration. In such cases you must re-register every subsequent semester and each summer session until your Paper/ Report has been submitted and graded.

RE-TAKING A FAILED COURSE

If at any time you fail a course outright, and are permitted to re-take the course, you will be required to self-register using CHOL during the appropriate semester. This repeat registration attracts the full per-credit cost of the course again as calculated on a prorated basis.

EXAMINATION RE-SITS OR RE-SUBMISSION OF COURSEWORK

If at any time during your programme you are unsuccessful in one component of a course, you may be given permission to re-sit the examination or re-submit coursework. In these cases an **Examinations Only** or **Coursework Only** registration must be done administratively. You will need to email gradstudies@cavehill.uwi.edu within the first 3 weeks of the semester in which the course is next offered with details of the course code for which you are to be registered.

NOTE TO SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

If you have a scholarship or other award please ensure that you have sufficient funds to cover **at least** one month's expenses as payment of sponsorship is normally delayed.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT FEES AND PAYMENT OBLIGATIONS FOR ALL STUDENTS

- 1. It is your responsibility to ensure that your fees are paid on time.
- 2. Unpaid fees have serious consequences including the implementation of Financial Holds which will prevent you from accessing academic facilities such as the E-learning system and the Library and will result in restricted access to the examination room to write final examinations.
- 3. You are expected to complete your registration during the assigned registration period at the start of each semester so that your Programme Fees can be promptly generated and paid.
- 4. You are not recognized as a student of The UWI until you have completed registration AND paid your fees or made satisfactory arrangements with the Bursary to do so.
- 5. You are permitted to make changes to your course registration until the end of the third week of the semester. Your fees will be adjusted accordingly.
- 6. If your fees are being paid by your government or other sponsor you MUST submit a letter from the government or sponsor confirming this. The University submits invoices for payment to governments and sponsors by the end of the third week of each semester. It is therefore crucial that if you experience any difficulty with payment of fees you should contact The Student Accounts Section of the Bursary before that deadline so that any problems can be dealt with. You will be required to honour any invoices that are not paid by your sponsor.
- 7. **GOVERNMENTS OF NON-CAMPUS CONTRIBUTING COUNTRIES** have different arrangements regarding sponsorship. It is your responsibility to confirm any level of sponsorship from your government and to present The University with a letter of confirmation of this sponsorship. Before taking up your place you should also ensure that you are able to meet any portion of fees that will not be met by your sponsor.
- 8. ALL STUDENTS WHO ARE NOT SPONSORED BY THEIR GOVERNMENT ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FULL PAYMENT OF ALL THEIR FEES.
- 9. Continuing students who have outstanding balances on their accounts must settle those arrears BEFORE they can register.

- 10. University Registration Fees are mandatory for ALL students, including sponsored students and scholarship holders, and are non-refundable.
- 11. Please be reminded that University Registration fees are billed to your account **every semester of registration** until your degree has been awarded.
- 12. The Cave Hill Campus offers flexible Payment Plans to assist students with the payment of **Programme Fees** only. Information on Payment Plans is available on the Campus website at http://www.cavehill.uwi.edu/financial/tuition-payment-plans.aspx

NATIONALS OF BARBADOS

- Sponsorship by the Government of Barbados is limited to students in <u>UGC-Funded Programmes</u> with an <u>Upper 2nd class or First Class Honours Undergraduate degree</u>. The Government of Barbados will pay your Tuition and Economic cost for the normal duration of the programme. You are expected to complete your programme within the designated time, plus 1 additional year, where applicable. Thereafter, you will be responsible for the payment of your fees (Tuition and Economic cost), and will be billed accordingly.
- For students in <u>Self-Financed Programmes</u> who are being sponsored by the Government of Barbados under the "<u>Areas of National Significance</u>", please note that Government sponsorship only applies to the stated cost of **one** (1) programme and the set number of credits for that programme. If you take additional courses, have failed, or have to repeat a course, the cost of the additional course(s) must be covered by you, and will be billed to your account. E.g. the cost of MSc Tourism and Sports Management is \$30,000. Government will be billed up to \$30,000 for 42 credits, and any balance due to repeats or additional courses is to be borne by the student. Students who are allowed to switch between programmes should be aware that the above policy also applies. Government will be billed for the cost of one (1) programme only based on the number of credits associated with that programme. Any credits/cost over the maximum to be billed to Government will be billed to the student.
