Country Eligibility	Applicants from the following countries are eligible: Anguilla, Antigua & Barbuda, Barbados, Belize, Commonwealth of Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Montserrat, St. Kitts & Nevis, St. Lucia, St Maarten, St. Vincent & the Grenadines and Suriname.
Academic standards	The scholarships awarded will depend upon the suitability of students. Eligibility and funding amounts will be based on student attributes, performance and needs as determined by UWI-CERMES and the funding partners.
Scholarship	Funding will be competitively offered.
Scope and coverage	The scholarship will cover university fees and/or living expenses.
Application and Selection	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Candidates who have applied to the CERMES MSc (NAREM) and MPhil/PhD (NRM) programmes can apply for the scholarship in writing to the Director of CERMES. The application letter should specify why the candidate believes that they should be awarded a scholarship and how they intend to use the knowledge gained from their CERMES programme to contribute to environmental sustainability in the Caribbean. The application letter should not exceed 1,000 words.

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. In addition to the above academic requirements, other factors will also be considered in the selection process including the economic circumstances of the candidate, practical experience, extra-curricular activities, non-academic qualifications and, for those taking leave to return to a substantive post, the relevance of the degree to discharge their responsibilities of the post. 3. Gender equality and non-discrimination will apply to all aspects of candidate selection. 4. The scholarship would be awarded to applicant(s) who have been admitted to the CERMES programmes.
