## ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CONDUCT OF SEMINARS:

- 1. Both students and supervisor should agree on seminar presentation date
- 2. At minimum the main supervisor should be present at the seminar
- 3. The 1st seminars should be about 20 minutes in duration
- 4. The 2nd and 3rd seminar presentations should be about 25-30 minutes in duration

- 5. Except in extentuating circumstances, one seminar should be done a semester. Where two semesters are conducted in one semester the content should be substantially different from each other
- 6. An assessment committee should be convened by the Deputy Dean, Research or equivalent to assess the presentation and provide feedback
- 7. The assessment tool should be made available to the student and assessment committee 5-7 days prior to the seminar
