LLM & Postgraduate Diploma Competition Law and Policy

This programme equips lawyers to address issues and problems arising in anticompetitive agreements, abuse of market dominance, and merger reviews, and so lays the foundation for the development of a Caribbean jurisprudence in these areas.

DRAFT 06 LLM and POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA COMPETITION LAW AND POLICY

The University of the West Indies (UWI) Master of Laws and Postgraduate Diploma programmes provides advanced legal education leading to a postgraduate qualification. It is aimed at legal practitioners, staff of competition authorities, academics, legislative draftspersons, and students of law seeking higher qualifications.

The LLM and Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy) programmes aim to enhance the ability of lawyers, economists and other qualified persons working in the competition law and policy sector throughout the region to function more effectively in analysing and defending anticompetitive agreements, abuse of market dominance, and to comply with the information and analyses requested from merging firms. It equips them to address the issues and problems arising in these areas, and in cross border anticompetitive cases, to serve as legal advisors and policy advisors to clients, including corporate clients and regional Governments, and to be better placed to undertake complex litigation before competition commissions, ordinary courts and the Caribbean Court of Justice (CCJ) or Privy Council. The programme lays the foundation for lawyers to contribute to the development of a Caribbean jurisprudence in the area of competition law and policy.

Entry Requirements

Persons are eligible to apply for admission into the UWI LLM and Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy) programmes if they meet any of the following:

- Graduates of The University of the West Indies holding the LLB degree;
- Graduates of The University of the West Indies or of an approved University holding a degree which includes such law subjects as shall satisfy the Board for Graduate Studies and Research;
- Graduates of The University of the West Indies or of an approved University, who have obtained a professional legal qualification and are eligible for admission to practise in any part of the Commonwealth;
- Persons who having obtained a professional legal qualification, are admitted to practise in any part of the Commonwealth, and who have also been certified as being in practice for a minimum of five years;
- Graduates of The University of the West Indies or of an approved University, who have obtained a degree in economics;
- Graduates of The University of the West Indies or of an approved University, who satisfy the Board for Graduate Studies and Research of their capability to undertake the course of study leading to the award of the UWI LLM or Postgraduate Diploma in Law degrees.

The suitability of applicants to the UWI LLM or the Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy) for the designated course of study will be determined in accordance with the above criteria, through an examination of their academic and practical experiences. Letters of reference will also be used to determine suitability. Students with a third class or pass degree will not normally be admitted to read for the UWI LLM (Competition Law and Policy).

Qualifying Examination

Applicants may, at the discretion of the Board for Graduate Studies and Research, be required to take a qualifying examination consisting of at least two papers of a minimum of two hours each. The exam will be of a standard equivalent to that of Part II or Part III of the LLB degree examination in order to satisfy the Board of their suitability to undertake the course of study leading to the UWI LLM and Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy).

Language of Instruction

The language of instruction is English and applicants whose native language is not English may be required to take an English Proficiency Test set on behalf of the Board for Graduate Studies and Research.

Method of Delivery

The courses for the LLM and Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy) will be delivered entirely online with modern distance learning techniques.

Any UWI LLM course taught by staff from one campus of The UWI will be available through e-learning and/or distance learning modalities to registrants from the other two campuses which offer the programme.

Time of Entry

Students must begin the PG Diploma/LLM (Competition Law and Policy) in Semester 1.

The first offering of the programme will begin in January 2024 and finish December 2024. Students will not have the option of part time for this first offering. The next offering will begin Semester 1, 2025 and every September thereafter.

Duration

- A student designated as a 'full-time' is required to complete the courses within a single academic year.
- A full-time student is required to read for a minimum of two (2) courses and a maximum of four (4) courses in any one semester.
- A student designated as a 'part-time' is required to read for a minimum of one (1) course or a maximum of two (2) courses per semester.
- The summer period is designated as a teaching session for the purposes of the UWI LLM degree and Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy).

Programme Structure / Course of Study

LLM

Candidates for the UWI LLM (Competition Law and Policy) must complete thirty-six (36) credit hours of the designated course of study comprised of six (6) courses of six (6) credits each.

The four (4) core courses are listed below. For the remaining credits, two (2) courses can be selected from any of the courses offered in the UWI LLM programme. With the permission of the Faculty, candidates may substitute a Research Paper on a topic in Competition Law and Policy for one (1) course of six (6) credits. Students must apply for approval to

register in Law 6900 Research Paper before the end of the second semester or teaching session from the commencement of the programme by the student.

The Research Paper must be completed at the end of the semester following the candidate's second semester or teaching session from date of registration in the course, whether or not the candidate has completed final written examinations for his or her courses.

Students unable to complete the full UWI LLM (Competition Law and Policy) are eligible to receive the Postgraduate Diploma upon successful completion of four (4) courses, of six (6) credits each.

Postgraduate Diploma

Candidates for the UWI Postgraduate Diploma (Competition Law and Policy) must complete twenty-four (24) credit hours of the designated course of study comprised of four (4) courses of six (6) credits each.

Cost

This is a self-financed programme.
