

Professor Akin Abayomi



Akin Abayomi is a specialist in Internal Medicine, Haem-Oncology, Environmental Health and Biosecurity. Akin studied at the Royal Medical College of Saint Bartholomew's Hospital in the University of London where he attained his first graduate degree in Medicine and progressing to obtain fellowships in Internal Medicine and Pathology from both Royal College of Medicine in the United Kingdom and the College of Pathology of South Africa. Akin has worked in several countries around the world in Internal Medicine and has been exposed to a variety of geographical variations of disease patterns within the discipline of Internal Medicine. Akin was a lecturer in the Cave Hill Campus of the University of the West Indies working as a Specialist in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital and Medical Director of the Lady Meade Reference Laboratory for a period of 10 years before taking up a professorial position in Cape Town South Africa. Akin also trained in ecosystem integrity, wilderness management and biosecurity and has a special interest in environmental health. Akin manages a 300 Acre research bio habitat forest conservation in Nigeria on the banks of the great Osun River in South West Nigeria. Akin is currently Professor of Clinical Medicine at the Nigerian Institute of Medical Research, Emeritus in the Department of Pathology, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, University of Stellenbosch in Cape Town, Principal Investigator of the Global Emerging Pathogens Treatment Consortium or GET and Consultant to the Lagos megacity biosecurity project.
