It will include what your business does, who your customers are and what makes your business from competition. A customer should have a clear understanding of your business and its Unique Selling Point after hearing your elevator pitch.



IP

Intellectual property (IP) refers to creations of the mind used in buying and selling for example, inventions, creative work, names and images. IP is protected by law and enables people to earn recognition for their creativity.

Entrepreneur

An individual who sets up a business, creates a new idea and who is willing to take a loss in order to make money.

Target Market

A group of customers a business chooses to focus its marketing efforts on.

USP (Unique Selling Point)

A benefit that a business offers to its customers that its competitors do not.
