### Carbon Footprint

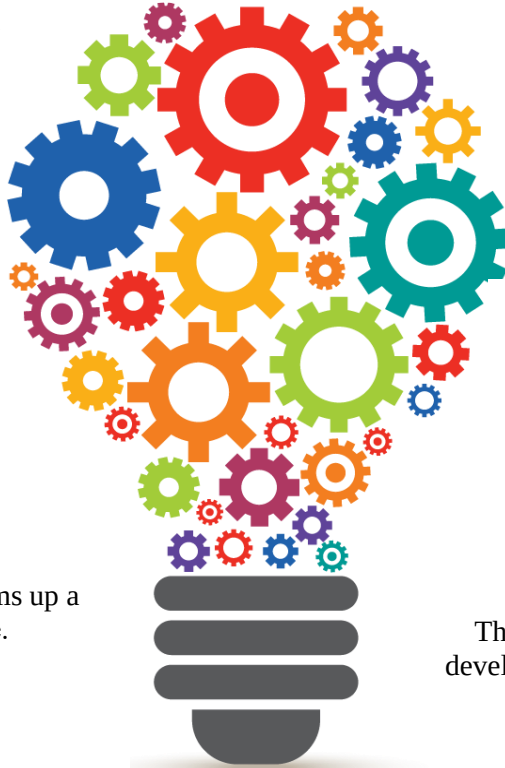
A measure of the impact that human activities have on climate in terms of the total amount of greenhouse gases produced.
